History of the East Carolina Wildlife Arts Festival and North Carolina Decoy Carving Championships

The East Carolina Wildfowl Guild, which is dedicated to providing educational activities associated with wildlife art and the preservation of the wildlife heritage that is so much part of Eastern North Carolina, has completed the sponsoring of fourteen very successful East Carolina Wildlife Arts Festivals and North Carolina Decoy Carving Championships. The 2010 event suspected to be no less successful with several new additions and changes. (1) The Southern Duck, Goose and Swan Calling Championships will become a two day event, Saturday and Sunday, due to the number of entries that are being received. (2) The hosting of the IWCA National Shore Bird Competition. (3) The addition of the Young Guns Youth Competition as a division. (4) The addition of several new exhibitors which will make the show even more diverse and exciting. (5) The addition of the DockDogs Competition that is regularly seen on the Outdoor Channel and ESPN. The event will be located in Kugler Field on Hudnell Street and will last from Friday through Sunday.

All events from previous years will continue to be held. The carving competition will again be held at the Red Men's Lodge on Third Street. Other events to be held include the National Competition for the North Carolina Duck Stamp, a competition for the North Carolina Junior Duck Stamp, the Kid's Zone sponsored by Washington Pediatrics, The East Carolina Bank's Sportsmen's Center, and the Wildlife Art and Decoy Auction with a buffet dinner at the Washington Yacht and Country Club. As last year, shuttle service will be provided between the different activities.

JUDGING RULES

1. The competition bird will be a **Ruddy Duck Drake–Winter or Summer Plumage** decorative style gunning decoy painted to the maximum of the carver's ability.
2. All entries shall be made of wood. Glass eyes and plastic inserts of elongated tail feathers on birds such as the Oldsquaw and Pintail are accepted.
3. All entries will be floated and must self right from any position.
4. All entries may be painted to the artist's highest ability.
5. No burning or other fine texturing will be allowed. Chip carving delineation of feather groupings, bill detail and elevated primaries will be allowed. Durable undercutting will be accepted.
6. All rules and regulations of the IWCA gunning decoy division will be observed.
7. Purchase award of \$1250.00 for the first place winner. The winning entry becomes the property of the East Carolina Wildfowl Guild.
8. Entries into this Division shall not be entered in any other Division at this year's event.
9. Stippling, sponging or combing will be allowed.

NOTE: This Division is open to all individuals, not just North Carolina residents.

3. IWCA traditional gunning rules apply.
4. Decoys can be constructed of wood, cork, or stretched canvas over wire.
5. The competition will be judged in Jacks Creek across from The Red Men's Lodge.
6. The decoys may be set and picked up by boat.
7. Decoys cannot be moved between divisions.

JUDGING RULES

1. 2009 entries will be a **wood Hooded Merganser Drake measuring no longer than 4 inches from breast to tail** with a weight and anchor line.
2. Pattern, attitude, and paint scheme may be the carver's choice within the guidelines of the current IWCA working decoy rules. Imagination is encouraged, however the basic rules must be adhered to and specifics of medium, size, species and sex are met and the entry represents the scaled down version of a working decoy that could be used by a waterfowl hunter.
3. Prior to floating all entries will be prejudged for correct measurement and have the anchor line with weight removed. Also, the judge will look at the workmanship, the accuracy of scale and compliance of all rules.
4. Entries must self right and float with the proper attitude.
5. Entries disqualified at prejudging will be placed in the tank after the 3rd best of show is chosen.
6. Everyone who enters will take home someone else's entry.
7. **Only One entry per carver.**

NOTE: The ECWG requests entrants in this division to submit a "practice bird" if at all possible which will be auctioned to help support the festival. Consideration of this will be appreciated.

JUDGING RULES

1. Open to all carvers 17 years and younger.
2. Entries will be judged in three age groups: ages 9 and under, 10-13, and 14-17.
3. The contest is for **working decoys only** and must be carved and painted by the carver. The carvings can be made of any carving material or stretched canvas.
4. Ribbons will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd in Species; 1st, 2nd, 3rd in Category; and 1st, 2nd, 3rd Best in Show.
5. Prizes will not be monetary.
6. Decoys will be judged for simplicity, durability, and practicality. No fragile parts.
7. If an entry deteriorates before the completion of judging, it will be disqualified.
8. Simple painting schemes encouraged.
9. Entries from age groups 10-13 and 14-17 will be floated and must self-right. Ages 9 and under will not be floated.
10. Judges will not judge a student's carving or relative's carving.
11. Judging will be held Sunday, February 7 at 11:30 a.m.

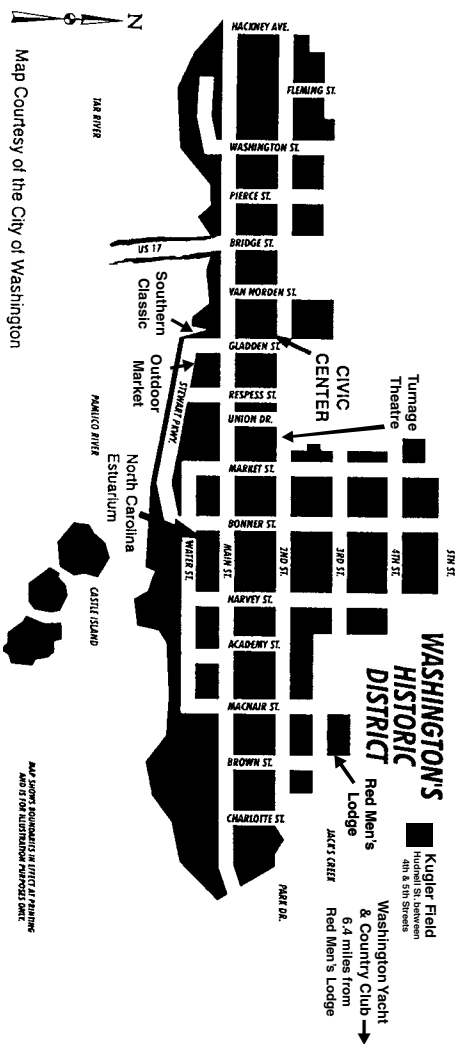
